Who We Are

The Delaware Developmental Disabilities Council has been working to improve the lives of children and adults with developmental disabilities since 1971.

Our mission is to make Delaware a state where all people with developmental disabilities are included, valued, and supported.

This means:

- ✓ Delawareans with and without disabilities live, learn, work, and have fun together.
- ✓ Everyone has the same opportunities in life.
- ✓ People have power and control over their own lives.

We are a state agency, but we are independent. That means we make all our own decisions.

People with developmental disabilities and family members of people with developmental disabilities lead our work, in partnership with other Council members.

The Council's funding comes from the federal government. We use our funding on the activities outlined in our State Plan.

Council staff, Council members, and organizations we give grants to work on our activities.

5-Year State Plan

Every 5 years the Council develops a plan that guides our work. This is called our State Plan. The Council's State Plan includes our most important goals and how we will accomplish them.

Our work is guided by a federal law called the Developmental Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act. It is better known as the DD Act.

To identify the most important issues we should work on, the Council:

- → Gets input from a lot of different people. This includes people with developmental disabilities, family members, state agencies, advocates, service providers, community members, and others.
- Reviews information from reports and other sources.
- Thinks about all the information to decide how the Council can make a difference.
- Decides how to use our staff time.
- → Decides what activities we will fund other organizations and groups to carry out.

After making these decisions, the Council sets goals for the next 5 years. Our State Plan also includes the activities we will work on to reach our goals.

The State Plan outlines the work we will focus on to make Delaware a state where all people with developmental disabilities are included, valued, and supported.

This State Plan covers October 1, 2021 – September 30, 2026.

Council Goals

The Council's goals for the 2022-2026 State Plan are:

<u>Advocacy</u>: Delawareans with developmental disabilities will have the knowledge, skills, and support they need to lead self-directed lives. This means they control their own lives and live the lives they want.

<u>Education and Early Intervention</u>: Education rules and programs in Delaware will better serve students with developmental disabilities. More children with developmental disabilities will get a better education.

<u>Housing</u>: Delawareans with developmental disabilities will have better access to training and resources about affordable, accessible, integrated housing in the community.

<u>Health and Healthcare</u>: More Delawareans with disabilities will get the healthcare and other services they need and want in the community.

Advocacy

Goal

Delawareans with developmental disabilities will have the knowledge, skills, and support they need to lead self-directed lives. This means they control their own lives and live the lives they want.

Objectives

- 1. The Delaware Developmental Disabilities Council will support the development of an active self-advocacy group in Delaware.
- 2. The Delaware Developmental Disabilities Council will support and pay for education, training, and resources that help people with disabilities, their families, and allies to help increase their knowledge and skills.
 - *Allies are people, groups, and organizations that support people with developmental disabilities and help bring about change.
- 3. The Delaware Developmental Disabilities Council will support and fund training for professionals that improves their ability to effectively communicate with people who do not rely on speech to meet their communication needs.

Education and Early Intervention

Goal

Education rules and programs in Delaware will better serve students with developmental disabilities. More children with developmental disabilities will get a better education.

Objectives

- 1. The Delaware Developmental Disabilities Council will train and support parents and allies to be effective advocates.
- 2. The Delaware Developmental Disabilities Council will inform Delawareans with disabilities and their families about important issues and resources, and support them to be a resource to others around the state.
- 3. The Delaware Developmental Disabilities Council will help the public understand what people with developmental disabilities and mental illness need. It will help identify barriers to services and what needs to change.

Housing

<u>Goal</u>

Delawareans with developmental disabilities will have better access to training and resources about affordable, accessible, integrated housing in the community.

*Accessible housing is housing that everyone can get into and use, including people who use wheelchairs or other equipment. Integrated housing is housing in the community where people with and without disabilities live.

Objectives

- The Delaware Developmental Disabilities Council will partner with other organizations
 to develop an online housing resource library for advocates and self-advocates.
 Information will be in plain language and focus on legal rights and access to
 accessible, affordable, integrated housing.
- 2. The Delaware Developmental Disabilities Council will advocate for and support people with disabilities from diverse backgrounds to be included on all Delaware housing committees.
 - *Diverse backgrounds are things like different disabilities, races, languages, and ways of living.

Health and Healthcare

Goal

More Delawareans with disabilities will get the healthcare and other services they need and want in the community.

Objectives

- 1. The Delaware Developmental Disabilities Council will work to improve transition services for people with developmental disabilities. Better services will help them get the supports they need at home and in the community instead of places that separate them from everyone else.
 - * Transition services help people find the services they need when they make a change like moving from school to adult services, moving out of their family's home, or leaving a facility.
- 2. The Delaware Developmental Disabilities Council will provide training and resources to help people with developmental disabilities effectively advocate for their health needs. This work will focus on African Americans and people who usually speak a language other than English.
