The Delaware Developmental Disabilities Council (DDC) wishes to congratulate you on your re-election as our United States Congressman. We anticipate that you will represent us in the fair and admirable way that you are known for here in Delaware.

The Developmental Disabilities Council falls under the federal Developmental Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act of 2000 (P.L. 106-402) and has equal Councils in each state and Territory. You are familiar with the work that we have done in Delaware in your role as Lt. Governor and then in your role, now, of Congressman.

The DD Councils are required to develop and fulfill a 5 year State Plan that is a collaborative event with people with disabilities and other disability organizations in each state. That plan is submitted to the Administration on Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (AIDD) and updated each year for approval and reporting (<http://www.acf.hhs.gov/programs/aidd>).
